From the Director

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

On April 3rd, we moved our Pinwheels for Prevention display from its usual spot at the Donahoe Center to the front lawn of the Old Court House in hopes that this new location would bring more awareness for child abuse prevention. The pinwheels represent the number of calls that were made to the agency with concerns for children. Last year. we received 2766 calls. Of those calls, 960 new cases were opened due to concerns of child safety. We are very grateful to those who spoke up on behalf of a child in need. The event was attended by several community members, county employees and elected officials. Commissioner Carlo presented a proclamation to Children Services and BACA (Bikers

Against Child Abuse) closed the event by reading their creed. The display will remain on the lawn through May 1st.

This year our annual "It Takes A Community" luncheon was expanded to include a Human trafficking training thanks to our partnership with the Ashtabula County Family and Children First Council. The luncheon was held on April 11th to coincide with the Statewide WEAR BLUE campaign. Many who attended wore blue to show their support for abused and neglected children. She is head of his Children's Initiatives and spoke of her first hand knowledge of the child welfare system as a former foster child and adoptee herself. During lunch, guests were entertained by Geneva's Image show choir—they are very impressive!

Ms. Haggerty followed up the luncheon by presenting the training on Human trafficking which has become a hot topic for child welfare thanks to Ohio's new law and protocol for dealing with perpetrators and victims.
